

GATHERING

The assembly **STANDS** and turns to face the baptismal font and funeral procession.

Welcome in the name of the Father, and of the +Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We are gathered to worship, to proclaim Christ crucified and risen, to remember before God our brother Dwight, to give thanks for his life, to commend him to our merciful redeemer, and to comfort one another in our grief.

A pall is placed upon the urn as a reminder of the righteousness of Christ we receive in Holy Baptism.

The LORD will rescue his servants; no one who takes refuge in him will be condemned.


SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 3:10-11; 4:7-8





PEACE The assembly is invited to share a greeting of God's peace with one another. Following the Peace, you may be seated for a few moments as the table is prepared.





Give us this day our daily bread;


and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION Please SIT






Let us commend Dwight to the mercy of God, our maker and redeemer.



Dwight Richard Ness, 72, of Belleville, IL, born July 14, 1952, in Mayville, ND, died Monday, May 19, 2025, at St. Elizabeth's Hospital, O'Fallon, IL.

Mr. Ness was a United States Air Force veteran and retired as a Major after 20 years of service. He continued his service in the Air Force Reserves, the Air Guard, and working in civil service at Scott AFB. Eventually he retired as a Lieutenant Colonel.

During high school, Dwight was a state runner-up in wrestling in the North Dakota state wrestling tournament. He received a scholarship from North Dakota State University in both football and wrestling and ultimately decided to pursue wrestling. Later, Dwight enjoyed using his talents to coach the Belleville Little Devils and Belleville East High School. He was a member of Peace Lutheran Church and then became a member of St. Mark Lutheran Church, Belleville, IL. Dwight was an avid quilter and painter. He enjoyed sewing at Cardinal Ritter Senior Center for several years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Richard and Verona, nee Ostlie, Ness.

He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Linda, nee Wassberg, Ness, whom he married on September 7, 1973; three sons, Andrew (Carolyn) Ness, Richard (Melissa) Ness, and Matthew Ness (Careen Jewel); five grandchildren, David, Erik, Ethan, Leighton, and Oscar; a sister, Melanie (Michael) Walsh; and many other dear family members.
