

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS Please STAND as you are able


Blessed be the one God - Father, +Son, and Holy Spirit - our maker, our helper, and our keeper. **Amen.**





COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION




Franklin School Lunch Packing

<u>VOLUNTEERS are needed!</u> Sign-up sheets are in the Narthex and the Parish Hall.

- 1) SET UP 3:30 TO 5:00PM: 4-5 PEOPLE to load two 8' tables, two half-tables and 6 chairs at the church and set them up at our space on East Main, unload and set-up a 10 x 10 canopy and transport 5-gallon containers of hot chocolate/water from the church to our space. Hang church signs and decorate the space after the canopy is set up.
- 2) HOT CHOCOLATE PREP: 3:30 TO 4:45PM: <u>2 PEOPLE</u> to heat water, fill containers and mix hot chocolate
- 3) HANDOUT HOT CHOCOLATE, SUCKERS AND OTHER GOODIES: 5:00 to 7:30: 4-6

From the Parish Nurse: Symptoms to Watch—Early Signs of Breast Cancer

Breast cancer doesn't always show early symptoms, which is why regular mammograms are so critical. Still, knowing what to look for helps you take charge of your health.

Common warning signs include:

- A new lump in the breast or underarm
- Swelling or thickening in part of the breast
- Skin changes, such as dimpling or redness
- Nipple changes, including pulling inward, itching, or unusual discharge
- Changes in breast size or shape
- Persistent pain or tenderness
- Swollen lymph nodes near the collarbone or underarm

Not all lumps are cancerous, but no change should be ignored. If something feels unusual, schedule an appointment with your healthcare provider. Acting quickly is always better than waiting.

Mammograms remain the gold standard for detecting breast cancer before symptoms appear.

Paired with self-awareness and routine checkups, they dramatically improve survival rates. Pay attention to your body—and encourage loved ones to do the same.

Table Talk on Hiatus

After prayerful consideration, I have decided to place the monthly **Table Talk** Bible class on indefinite hiatus.

St. Mark Table Talk began in the fall of 2017 as a relaxed, midweek, single-topic Bible study—a successor to the long-running Tuesday morning Bible class. It was designed to stand alone from week to week and to offer an alternative for those who preferred not to attend a class after Sunday worship. Over the years, Table Talk provided a welcoming, conversational space to share faith and insights over lunch.

Attendance was strong in the early years, but—like many ministries—Table Talk never fully recovered after the COVID-19 pandemic. Participation has steadily declined, with recent classes drawing only a handful of people, most of whom also attend Sunday's Adult Forum. After much reflection, it seems the best use of time and energy is to incorporate upcoming Table Talk topics into the Sunday morning schedule rather than continue a separate session.

I remain deeply grateful for all who have taken part in Table Talk since its beginning. Your curiosity, conversation, and companionship have made these gatherings a rich part of our shared ministry. Thank you for the insights and stories and experiences we've shared together around the table! - Pastor Brian
