- If you are unable to go to the altar for communion, please notify an usher or the pastor, so that communion may be brought to you in your pew.





July is <u>UV Safety Awareness Month</u> or in lay terms, **Sun Safety**. This is the month we raise awareness about the dangers of ultraviolet (UV) radiation and promote sun safety practices. This month encourages everyone to take precautions to protect their skin and eyes from the harmful effects of UV rays which can lead to skin cancer, cataracts, and premature aging.

Before you catching rays by the pool or taking part in other outdoor activities, make sure you know how to protect yourself from harmful UV light.

Why is UV Safety Important?

- Skin Cancer Risk: Prolonged exposure to UV radiation is a major risk factor for skin cancer.
- **Premature Aging:** UV rays can damage collagen and elastin in the skin, leading to wrinkles, age spots, and other signs of premature aging.
- **Eye Damage:** UV radiation can also harm the eyes, increasing the risk of cataracts and other eye problems.
