Worship Focus for May – Female Musicians

This month, we are featuring in our worship services some female musicians who have had an influence on our music today. Each week features a short biography on the individual and a prelude or postlude they have composed. Come a few minutes early, read their bio (below), and hear beautiful music as you prepare for worship.

Today's Composer Spotlight - Florence Price (1887 - 1953)

This lady was a child prodigy! At the turn of the century, she was breaking barriers in race and gender. She gave her first recital at age 4, had her first composition published at age 11, and graduated high school as valedictorian at age 14. Four years later, she graduated with honors from the New England Conservatory of Music, having earned an artist diploma in organ and a teaching certificate. During that time, she wrote her first symphony. Ms. Price began as a pianist/organist then focused on composition but continued to



perform. She taught at small colleges in Arkansas and Atlanta and became the head of the Music Department at Clark Atlanta University in Georgia. Her music was influenced by spirituals and African Church music. Ms. Price became the first African-American female to have a major United States symphony (the Chicago Symphony) perform her work. Most of her compositions were symphonic, however she began as an organist and did write for organ. You will hear one of her pieces as this morning's **prelude**.
