From the Parish Nurse...

June is National Safety Month! This is a good time to focus on key safety practices in different areas of your life. Today, the focus is on **Safety in the Home**.

Home safety is all about preventing accidents, injuries, and security threats. Some key areas to focus on:

- **Fire Safety:** Install smoke alarms in every sleeping area and on each floor. Keep fire extinguishers handy, especially in the kitchen. Ensure your family has a designated fire escape route. If you have a second story, you can purchase a residential fire escape ladder. Never smoke in bed or anywhere else you could fall asleep. Smoking is the leading cause of death in the home. Never leave burning candles unattended. Use flameless candles instead. When using a space heater, keep flammable materials 3 feet away. Turn all space heaters off when leaving a room
- **Electrical Safety:** Avoid overloading circuits and unplug unused devices to prevent electrical fires. Do not charge your computer or phones while they are lying on beds or carpets, as it could cause a fire.
- **Fall Prevention:** Keep floors dry, use sturdy step stools, and secure rugs to prevent slipping. Remove throw rugs to prevent trips or falls. Use gates to block stairs so young children cannot access them. Make sure staircases are well-lit, free from clutter, have no loose carpeting, and have handrails, both inside and out.. Request anyone who uses a bicycle or a skateboard to wear an approved helmet.
- **Security Measures:** Lock doors and windows, install security cameras and a home security system, and use motion-sensor lights to deter intruders.
- **Poison Prevention:** Store cleaning supplies and medications out of reach of children. Get family members and pets out of a room before you use pesticides in it. Lock away loose or spare batteries, since they pose poisoning and choking risks.
- **Kitchen Safety:** Be cautious with sharp objects and hot surfaces. Close the dishwasher door when not in use to avoid trips and falls. Secure cabinets and drawers from toddlers or young children. Use the back burners of stoves to heat food, to prevent pots from being accidentally knocked off and falling on someone. Stay with the stove when you are cooking. Cooking mishaps are the number one cause of fire in the home. Always make sure the burners are turned off after cooking.
- **Miscellaneous safety Measures:** Use cordless blinds to prevent strangulation if a child were to get caught in the cord. Cut drawstrings on hoodies, waistbands, and other clothing items for your children. Keep plastic bags away from children to prevent suffocation
